

JULY KENDALL VILLAGE BOARD MEETING

The July board meeting for the Village of Kendall was brought to order July 13, 2020 at 5:30PM by President R Martin with board members W Bunk, A Keenan, D Larson, C Moten, M Prell and L Wyttenbach present.

Also present were Public Works Director Gruen, and 8 visitors.

*Motion made by Keenan 2nd by Bunk to accept the June meeting minutes. MC

*Motion made by Moten and 2nd by Bunk to accept June bills with the inclusion of Modern Disposal for June \$104.00 from General Fund account. MC

*Motion made by Prell and 2nd by Larson to accept June Treasurer's Report. MC

*Clerk/Treasurer's report was given.

*Public Works' report was given.

*No Law Enforcement report was given; Marshal was not present.

*Public Comments: Jeannie Jones presented \$435.00 to the board that was raised from the Kendall Garden Walk to go towards new shrubs and other landscaping needs in the gazebo park.

*Prell brought up few properties around the village with overgrown weeds and grass that need to be addressed.

*Martin was contacted by the WI DOT about Hwy 71 going through the village to be repaved in 2027. Now is the time to start gathering information and ideas for things like replacing the lighting along South Railroad St.

*A complaint was received by the Clerk's office about the intersection of Hall St and Newton St. being very slippery year-round because of water runoff from a residence due to algae forming in the summer and ice forming in the winter. Public Works Director will look into options and costs for correcting/redirecting the water.

*Motion made by Keenan, 2nd by Wyttenbach to allow E. Shoenfeld to have a 2nd water meter installed at 203 Waffle St. for the purpose of filling their pool and watering their lawn. Any future requests for a 2nd water meter to be added to a residence will be handled on a case by case basis. MC

*Voting Machine replacement was tabled until the August monthly board meeting to allow the clerk to speak to other municipalities that already use paper ballots and gather more information.

*A discussion took place but no decision was made about whether or not to hire a high school student to do a work study with public works during the 2020-21 school year.

*Motion made by Prell was made to allow the ATV/UTV Club to host a tractor pull Labor Day weekend either in the village park or on North Railroad St. No second was made.

*Kendall Community Hall will remain closed to the public.

*A decision to hire someone to fix headstones in the cemetery was tabled until after a decision is made about the public works work study student.

*The Kendall Depot will remain closed until further notice.

*Motion made by Wyttenbach 2nd by Larson approving an operator license for Rosalyn Chamberlin at the Pony Express. MC

*An update on the flood damaged trailer located at 217 West St owned by Robin Thomson as given. An offer was made to Mr. Thompson by Coulee Cap to remove the old trailer, fill in the lot and put in a new trailer on a new slab. More updates will be provided as they are received.

*Larson received complaints about garbage behind the Sugar Maple Inn piling up and smelling bad. A letter will be sent to the owner asking them to dispose of the garbage.

*Motion made by Bunk 2nd by Moten to adjourn. MC
